

Cookie Notice 2020

This Cookie Notice (“**Notice**”) explains how the Kadas Prize Foundation, a company registered in England and Wales with company number (08991513), registered charity number (1157614) and registered address of The Harley Building, 79 New Cavendish Street, London W1W 6XB (“**we**”, “**our**”, “**us**”) uses cookies and other tracking technologies through our website www.ninedotsprize.org/. This is to be read alongside our [Privacy Policy](#) which explains how we use personal information.

If you do not accept our use of cookies please disable them following our guidance below.

1. What are cookies?

Like most websites, our website uses cookies.

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or mobile device, that contain details of your browsing history on the website and distinguish you from other users. They are widely used and help to provide you with relevant and personalised content, and help make websites work more efficiently. Your browser sends cookies back to the website every time you visit, so it can recognise you and can tailor what you see on the screen.

2. Why do we use cookies?

1. To **let you do things on our website** – for example, cookies enable you to log in to secure areas of our website, fill in application forms or view content.
2. To collect **anonymous statistics** – the information collected by cookies enables us to improve the website through usage figures and patterns. For example, it is really useful to see which pages of the website – and therefore which of our services – are the most popular and how users are interacting with them.
3. To **improve your experience of our website** – for example, to prevent you having to re-enter details when you have already done so, or by ensuring that users can find what they are looking for easily.
4. To **ensure that our website is secure** – for example, to make sure that personal information that you give to us does not fall into the wrong hands.

3. Turning cookies off

Internet browsers normally accept cookies by default. However, most browsers let you turn off either all or third-party cookies. What you are able to do depends on which browser you are using. If you do not accept our use of cookies as set out above, please set your browser to reject cookies. However, please be aware that this may impair or limit your ability to use our website. The option to do this is usually found in the options, settings or preferences menu of your browser or mobile device.
